



CHAPTER 20 DO DEEDS FOLLOW WORDS?




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


She explains the meaning of the Slokas to the women, while her son Krishna is at the background listening with keen interest. She is seeing telling the women-





When the ladies disperse a blind man comes begging for alms. He is rebuked by the woman and sent away.










The scene shifts to his father who is an upper division clerk in some office. He lectures his son on the value of education and how pupils should study and get promoted from class to class, whatever the difficulties.






The father didn't hesitate to utter a lie-





When the class is dismissed, Krishna asks the teacher-











The distracted parents send for the teacher who hears Krishna speak further-
